— In addition to tours with volunteer guides, new paid tours offering special experiences will also be introduced—



The “Narita Airport Transit & Stay Program” was suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but the Narita Airport Transit & Stay Program Liaison Committee will relaunch the program on Thursday, October 1, 2026 ! In response to the recovery in demand for inbound travel to Japan, the program will make its full-scale comeback after a six-year hiatus, once again showcasing the attractions of the area around Narita Airport to the world.

A tourism program aimed at transit passengers and inbound tourists staying near the airport, it will offer participants firsthand experiences of the region’s history, culture, nature, cuisine, and other attractions. As well as the immensely popular tours with volunteer guides, the relaunch will also see the addition of new paid tours offering special local experiences, including opportunities to enjoy festivals and participate in cultural activities. Ahead of the full relaunch in October, the first of these paid tours, the “Sogo Reido Temple Otaiyasai Festival Float-Pulling Experience,” will be held on Saturday, September 5.

Transforming people’s time at Narita Airport into an encounter with the charms of Japan. We will connect travelers from all around the world with the local communities, and offer them new journeys that begin at Narita Airport.

What is the Narita Airport Transit & Stay Program?

- Launched in 2015, the program has garnered high ratings on TripAdvisor, and has been selected as one of the top 10% of the world’s tourist destinations
- More than 200 volunteer guides, including local residents and students, guide travelers around the region.
- **Bookings for tours with volunteer guides will start to be taken on Tuesday, September 15**
