The 5th floor area (and part of the 4th floor area) of Terminal 1 at Narita Airport, including the Observation Deck, will go through renovation work.

This renovation project aims to provide a new value of "Enjoying your stay" at Narita Airport, the aerial gateway of Japan, under the theme of "Abundant water and the changing four seasons that nurture Japan's culture and spirituality."

We will steadily promote the renovation project towards the start of service in the spring of 2026, aiming to provide more convenience and comfort to our customers.

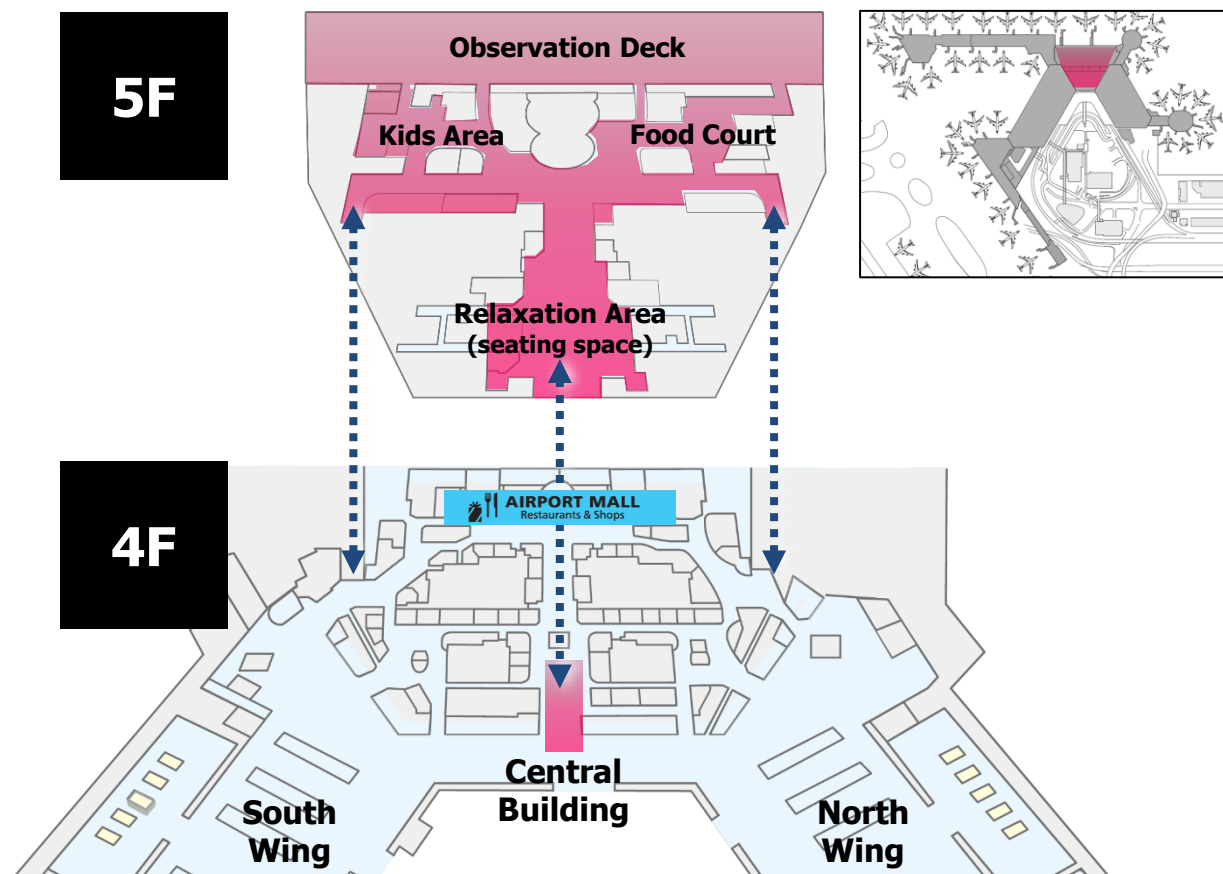

Construction starts in April 2025, and service is scheduled to start in the spring of 2026

<Other>

- According to the renovation project, the Observation Deck of Terminal 1 will be entirely closed from April 7, 2025, to the start of service in the spring of 2026.
