Events in February will include making origami, Ukiyo-e printing, Kimono dress up, Samurai armor as well as ninja outfits for children.



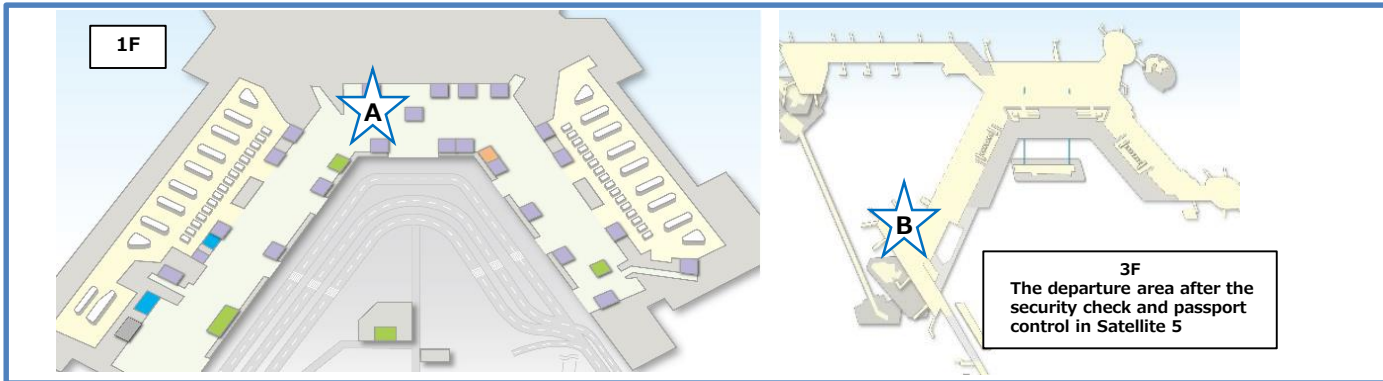
